

800 registered voters in California aged 18+


- Representative of California registered voter population in terms of gender, age, region, race, education, and party identification
- Fieldwork was conducted from November 2 November 16, 2021



WHAT MATTERS TO CALIFORNIANS?

Despite living in the tech capital, Californians are not concerned with the regulation of tech companies - they're more concerned with matters that impact their wallets and wellbeing


(Q1.) The following is a list of issues that some people feel are impacting the country. How concerned would you say you are with each? Answer choices: very concerned, not concerned at all



In this climate, voters want politicians addressing their financial concerns - only one in ten see regulation of tech companies as a top concern

Top concerns faced by Californians:



62% of Republicans rank rising prices as their top 1-5 ranked concern

60% of Democrats rank COVID-19 and climate change as their top 1-5 ranked concerns




ATTITUDES TOWARD TECH REGULATION

(Q11.) Looking at the following list of potential ways that technology products and services could be regulated, which would you say are the TWO MOST important to you?


MOST important tech regulations (top 2 most important):



They place value in app and online platform features that vet for security and viruses or provide consumer conveniences


(Q7.) How valuable do you consider the following offerings from apps or online platforms to be in your daily life, if at all?

Similarly, security, convenience, and privacy are features of their smartphones they find most valuable


(Q6.) Which of the following would you say you value MOST about you and your family's smartphones? Please select the three you value most.




RESULTS BY PARTY IDENTIFICATION

Republicans and Democrats don't have the same key concerns, but do agree that the regulation of tech companies isn't one of them
