As the inaugural AI Insight Forum approaches, we commend your strong commitment to spearheading inclusive conversations around the regulation of systems that are driven by artificial intelligence (AI). Because of your efforts, over a hundred AI stakeholders, including civil society, small business, and other private sector representatives, have been able to weigh in on the future of AI regulation in the U.S.

Earlier this year, Chamber of Progress, Engine, and the Small Business & Entrepreneurship Council wrote to urge you and your colleagues to consider the unique needs of AI small businesses in the responsible evolution of AI technology. We are pleased to note that the list of attendees for the AI Forum you are planning on September 13 includes representatives from both civil society and small businesses, a step in the right direction.
